ATM2122/01 Welcome

Councillor Charlie Shepherd, the Chair of Penrith Town Council and Mayor of Penrith welcomed everyone present to the meeting.

ATM2122/02 Apologies

The meeting received apologies from Penrith Town Councillors M Clark, S Clarke, D Knaggs and H Snell.

ATM2122/03 Minutes

The meeting was asked to receive the minutes from the Annual Town Meeting held on Monday 15 March 2021.

The minutes of the Annual Town Meeting held on 15 March 2021 be received and signed by the Mayor.

ATM2122/04 Civic Year 2021-22

The meeting received an overview of the civic year from Councillor Charlie Shepherd, the Mayor of Penrith who acknowledged how incredibly challenging the previous couple of years had been and thanked the local community for their compassion, support and resilience. The importance of collaborative working was highlighted as well as the importance of recognising the contribution all those who live, work, attend school or otherwise such as retired people make to the community.

Looking forward, Councillor Shepherd highlighted the need to concentrate on priority projects such as the climate change strategy, increasing and improving the arts and cultural offer for Penrith, ensuring that the findings of the Parking

and Movement Study, carried out in conjunction with Cumbria County Council and Eden District Council, were realised as soon as possible and enhancing Thacka Beck field.

Councillor Shepherd talked about the challenges and opportunities arising from the creation of two new unitary authorities. With an overall goal to ensure the Town Council engages in the right way, he encouraged more people to participate in what the Town Council does so that they had a role in the decision making and planning that affects their life, the lives of their families and other people in the local community.

Councillor Shepherd said it had been an honour and a pleasure to have been Mayor for the previous 12 months.
